Post Summary Corrections Data Availability Changes

BACKGROUND:

On June 4, 2011, U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) deployed Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) capabilities to file Post Summary Corrections (PSC) for Consumption and Antidumping/Countervailing (AD/CVD) entry summaries (entry type 01 and 03) via Electronic Data Interchange (EDI).

During the initial PSC deployment, two new filer ownership definitions were added to the system to determine what level of information would be returned via the entry summary query and ACE Reports. The two new filer ownership definitions were **Owner** and **Semi-Private Owner**. ACE compares the “Entry Filer Code” on the B-record of the entry summary query with the “Filer Code” on the entry summary block control table for the latest entry summary version on file. If the filer codes match, then the filer submitting the entry summary query is considered the **Owner**. However, if the filer is not the current Owner, but has been an Owner on a previous entry summary version, then the filer is considered a **Semi-private Owner**. Pursuant to this initial PSC deployment, only the **Owner** could have access to the latest version of the entry summary.

UPDATED CAPABILITY:

Effective July 27, 2013, CBP will enhance the PSC functionality in ACE providing entry summary data to filers of all versions of the entry summary. Changes will be made to the outbound response message of the ACE ABI entry summary and Census warning query. On August 10, 2013, CBP is planning to deploy changes to ACE Reports making the latest entry summary information details available to current or previous owners of the entry summary. Therefore, no separation of information between owner and semi-private owner will occur after these changes are deployed on July 27, 2013 and on August 10, 2013. CBP will be publishing a Federal Register Notice in the near future announcing these changes.
